

The Churchwardens at Holy Trinity: Daphne Armstrong and Sheila Holliday

The churchwardens have an important role to play in the life of the church. Much of what they do is behind the ensuring that everything scenes. runs smoothly. They are responsible for all the buildings and contents of the church and for ensuring that all worship is properly conducted as well as the welfare of the clergy and their family. This role extends to all members of the church as they are responsible for the well being of the congregation and ensuring that there is peace and harmony!

Sheila has lived in Fareham since 1976, is married to John and has three children. They began attending Holy Trinity in 1984 when the children expressed an interest in joining the choir. Sheila and John subsequently joined the choir too and soon the family were very much part of church life. Sheila still enjoys singing (and painting) whenever she has the time! Sheila is currently an A-Level examiner in German.

Daphne is married to Tony and has two daughters. As a young mum, Daphne joined the 'Young Wives' Group' in 1985 and was made to feel part of the church community. Daphne is now retired but was a civil servant and worked mainly in London and the Portsmouth Naval Base. She enjoys cooking, reading and music. Daphne is relatively new to the role of churchwarden but has recently been PCC secretary and has a good working knowledge of the parish and its people.



When there was a vacancy for churchwarden, both women were asked several times to consider the position and prayerfully reflected on what this would mean for them personally. As busy people, both wondered how they would find the time but decided that if God was needing them to fulfill this role He would provide the space and resources. Sheila and Daphne felt that with God's support and the support of other church members they would be able to use their gifts to undertake this voluntary role.

A challenge for both wardens is to remember to nourish their own spiritual life as it can be difficult to relax into worship on a Sunday morning when they are busy ensuring that everything is organised for the service.

Both women feel privileged to be churchwardens and be able to play a key role in the church community. As they stand at the back of the church they both enjoy meeting people and try their best to ensure that everyone is made to feel as welcome as they both did over 25 years ago.

# Thoughts from our Vicar



I'm slowly adjusting to life without the Olympics in the lull before the Paralympics begin. Beforehand, I was rather weary of Olympic mania but, like so many of the country (and world?), I was hooked the moment they got underway. Of course, we couldn't keep that level of attention and excitement forever but it was rather sad when it all finished. Now we have the big question: how do we build on all that has been achieved at London 2012?

What next? is the question we're asking at Holy Trinity, among the churches in Fareham and in the Deanery, following the success of the Art Exhibition in July. It was a big event for us! We enjoyed working together and there was a real buzz in the church throughout the day. We were delighted and humbled by all who came to look – sometimes returning several times. There was a tremendous sense of friendship and

openness to God. People seemed to feel safe and able to get quite a lot lifted off their aching shoulders – Anne House's art helped them to see and possibly to hope again that God might be deeply committed and interested in them.

There's a lot in the New Testament about the first Christians being called and sent out. Here was an occasion where people were being called to come in! We discovered that people rather liked it and in some cases, were just waiting to be invited or have a reason to step over the threshold. Now there's something to think about!

We've got quite a lot going on this Autumn: in September alone we have Harvest on 16th, Messy Church on 27th, a parish walk on 29th, Back to Church Sunday on 30th and a Quiz night, a concert and a couple of smaller exhibitions in October. Let's use these events as an opportunity to invite people along so we might continue what began with the Visions of Hope Exhibition: the breaking down of barriers and the mystique of the church and building up trust in God. Let's commit to showing as many people as possible that Holy Trinity Church exists for all - because without them, we are not yet the community that God has called us to

For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son. Whoever puts his trust in God's Son will not be lost but will have life that lasts forever.
